CALL TO EVANGELIZE

Bishop John O. Barres recently released his 2019 Lenten Letter and in it we can learn a great deal on how to be a good Christian steward.

When we read his letter, we see a different part of being a steward that we may sometimes forget about.

That vital part is where do we receive our strength and energy from?

We sometimes may get so wrapped up in deadlines, organizing and scheduling that we forget what our purpose is...or should be.

When we find ourselves becoming "too busy to pray" we need to STOP and re-focus ourselves in God. Bishop Barres quotes the words of Psalm 119, **"Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path.**"

This Lenten season, Bishop Barres invites us to practice the ancient tradition of *lectio divina*. By using the Pillars of Prayer and Formation, this practice goes beyond just reading the Bible, but rather diving into it and letting the Holy Spirit guide and shape you.

Bishop Barres stresses, "Adoration, praise and thanksgiving have a way of giving the soul peace, perspective and illumination in dealing with the whirlpool of daily problems and worries." We cannot spread God's Word effectively in our ministries if we do not let God empower and guide us in our work.
